IN WITH THE NEW (ROOF)!







STAFF SPOTLIGHT

Dave Haag (Arborist) & Adam Alves (Forester Specialist)

Dave and Adam are responsible for managing the trees on all county owned lands including the 12,000+ acres managed by Dane County Parks. You may see them out after a storm, removing trees and branches that are blocking trails. They also monitor the trees for diseases, pest, and possible public safety hazards. Last year they worked with friends and partner groups to plant over 4,000 trees and native shrubs, expanding species diversity in our parks and including a number of orchards where the public can forage for fruit.


Dave and Adam also host a number of volunteer workdays and educational events, such as Arbor Fairs and adaptive climbing events so youth of all abilities can learn about and climb trees. One of these adaptive events is a Dream Night program for terminally ill and critically ill children and their families. This event gives the kids a fun outdoor experience and a day away from the hospital.

STORM CLEANUP

Our forestry crew has been working hard all week to clean up damage from recent storms. They are removing downed or damaged trees and branches on trails, disc golf courses, campgrounds, and other park areas. In addition to blocking access, downed or damaged trees can create a safety hazard for park visitors. If you see our forestry staff out in the parks, make sure to give them space and don't pass into any areas where they have set up caution tape.










WILDLIFE SPOTLIGHT


